“THE PUBLIC PROCUREMENT ACT 2011 (AS AMENDED IN 2016) – COMPLIANCE AND PRACTICE”

This course is dedicated to new issues introduced in the *Public Procurement (Amendment) Act, 2016*; the principal Act i.e. *Public Procurement Act, 2011*, *Public Procurement Regulations, 2013* and *Public Procurement Regulations (Amendment) 2016*.

1.0 Course Rationale

- To expose participants to the Public Procurement Act 2011 as amended in 2016, so as to administer its compliance in procurement activities.
- To enhance procurement performance and attain value for money within and across government contracting authorities.
- To enable Suppliers/Contractors/Consultants and Procuring Entities make objective decisions in tendering and award of contracts.
- To assist in the fight against corruption in procurement through outlining rights and obligations of different parties involved in government contracting.

2.0 Course Content Includes but is not limited to:

- The Public Procurement Cycle
- Public Procurement Legal Framework and Institutional Set up.
- Highlights on the Major Provisions Contained in the Public Procurement (Amendment) Act, 2016 and its Regulations (Amendment) 2016
- Public Procurement Methods and Conditions for Use
- Procurement of Sector-Specific Goods and Services.
- Preparation and Use of Standard Tendering Documents
- Preference and Reservation Schemes
- Handling of Procurement Complaints

3.0 Target Group

The course is relevant to all government institutions including local government authorities but specifically meant to Tender Board members, PMU staff, and all those who are in one way or another involved in the procurement process e.g. auditors and evaluation teams. Suppliers, construction and consulting firms vying for public financed projects will find the course appropriate. Academicians and anti-corruption agencies and pressure groups are also welcome. The program is highly intensive, addressing practical issues and all facilitators have requisite skills and extensive hands-on

experience in their relevant areas. Former PPRA CEO – Ramadhani Mlinga PhD, will be among key resource persons.

Teaching methodology will include classroom lectures, case studies and group assignments. Participants will be awarded certificates, qualifying them to claim for 'CPD' hours where applicable.
